

A Day in the Life of an Aerotech Supervisor

An Aerotech Supervisor is a trained volunteer or employee of the Rural Fire Service whose job is to direct operations - fire bombing, protecting houses, moving people and equipment to where they are needed, etc. On Peter's first day as a qualified Aerotech Supervisor he was in Tumut. The fire was out and the fire fighters were sitting around swapping war stories. He received an SMS to say that his farm was on fire so he jumped into his plane and, after a very quick of 23 minute flight, arrived at Yalcowinna. Supervisors usually handle no more than five craft. Peter found himself in a \$2.1million B2Squirrel controlling six helicopters, 4 fixed wing bombers in relays from Cooma and another at Lake Eucumbene. He was also operating 4 radios and liaising with three divisional commanders on the ground. It was a very surreal experience with three directional winds, spot fires and smoke all around. During his training Peter was less than impressed that supervisors were only allowed to work for three consecutive days. However, after Peter's three days on the job he realised why. He was totally mentally exhausted and could hardly drive himself home. The Murrumbucca fires were Peter's first experience as an Aerotech Supervisor.

# **Brian Jeffries - Vocational Services Director -**

#### **Peter Davis - Foundation Director -**

The Rotary Foundation is Rotary's charity and Peter encourages us all to donate generously to the Foundation either by an annual, tax deductable donation or by putting a weekly donation into the wooden pot that does the rounds at each meeting. The main initiative of Rotary International is to **eradicate polio** from the world. Nigeria has now been polio free for twelve months and if that continues for another two years, South Africa will be declared polio free. The only countries left are Pakistan and Afghanistan. The political situation in these countries is a major difficulty but education programs about polio and inoculation will continue whenever possible.

Ally will be staying with Brenda and Ash till Sunday and will then move to the John-Natley household, after which she will move to the non-Rotarian family of Michelle McGufficke.
