

A raft guide for over 20 years, Richard is now taking people on unrelatively unexplored sections of the Snowy River as well as surveying the platypus numbers there. This survey needs frequent trips down the river. His favourite parts are the Byadbo Wilderness and following the river down to the Victorian border. Negotiating the Snowy Falls can take many hours. Artefacts such as canoe trees and stone axes have been found.
