GUEST SPEAKER:

Lil Frezza – Cooma RSPCA



Lil, a long time resident of Cooma, has been president of the RSPCA for 24 years. The group was formed in 1981 and now has 20 members, all bound together by their love of animals.

The group is very proud of the fact that the local pound does not have to put down any animal as homes are found for all of them. The group is always happy to hear from people who are prepared to be foster pet owners while animals are waiting to be rehoused.

At one time she was an honorary inspector and had to investigate some difficult situations, the humans involved often being belligerent. These days, the inspector is based on the south coast, is in a paid position and visits here every month or so. She is an authoritative person wearing the uniform of a special constable. She is empowered to enter premises, interview people, carry a firearm and take specific cases to court if her instructions are not obeyed.

Often, neglect of animals is a result of lack of knowledge, so part of the RSPCA's work is education.

Members have to be informed as to correct policies and procedures. There is a high level of accountability and the keeping of records is essential.

The majority of the group's funds is spent on veterinary fees such as vaccinations and micro-chipping, incurred while animals are being prepared for rehousing. Low income pet owners are often helped financially.

The major challenge of the group is membership, attracting younger and more energetic members.
