## MONARO EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICE (MEIS)

Rhonda showed us the centre, the original building and the cottage that was purchased and then refurbished. The Rotary Foundation and the Cooma Club donated \$12,000 towards the reburbishment so that the service can now offer individual treatment rooms for such therapies as speech, psychology, and occupational.


MEIS serves three shires, CoomaMonaro, Snowy River and Bombala. Originally, the majority of clients were from the Cooma-Monaro Shire but now over half come from Snowy River and Bombala, an indication that there is greater outreach to these shires.

The purpose of the service is to build better lives for families that have children with disabilities or developmental delays. All members of the families are affected when a child has such a condition and can become isolated within their communities. It is the belief of MEIS that all children, regardless of their condition, have a right to social participation in their communities.
