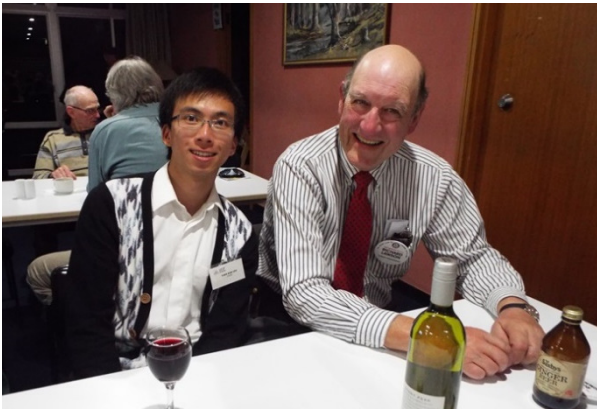
BACK TO COOMA WEEKEND

GUEST SPEAKER – Pip Giovannelli

A heritage consultant for councils in the south-east area, Pip showed some pictures, including some Cooma sites, illustrating his talk. What is a heritage site? A place that has cultural significance for past, present or future generations. He spoke about the reasons that sites are classified as heritage: aesthetic, historic, spiritual, cultural, scientific/technical, and social. The sites could be buildings, memorials or precincts. There are some restrictions applying to changes to heritage listed buildings and these often have to be negotiated before any work can be undertaken. There are statutory bodies e.g. governments, and non-statutory bodies such as the Heritage Trust.
