#### **THREE MINUTER – John Ch**

John spoke about Waterwatch, run by the Murrumbidgee Catchment authority. Once a month volunteers visit each of the creeks in the area and take samples of the water. This means that the effluent from various places is monitored and if necessary, prosecution can occur. The group is interested in more volunteers – the time involved is one hour on the third Sunday of the month.

#### **GUEST SPEAKER: Charles Hill**

A member of the Tuggeranong club, Charles has been Chair of the Rotary Youth Exchange and is now speaking about Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM) which is under the umbrella of RAWCS (Rotary Australia World Community Service).

The female anopheles mosquito is responsible for the spread of the disease which is one of the biggest causes of mortality, especially in infants and pregnant women, 1-3 million people dying annually. RAM has been involved in preventative measures, draining unwanted water where mosquitoes breed and has developed a chemically impregnated mosquito net which not only repels mosquitoes but kills them.



RAM has also conducted education programs in malaria affected areas which contain over 60% of the world's population. 2.3 billion people are exposed to this threat, with 300-500 million people being infected.

It is important to keep windows and doors closed at dawn and early evening as the mosquitoes enter houses then and hide in dark places. Areas affected by malaria are growing.

RAM would like a donation of \$20,000 from this district (which means about \$500 from each club) to assist in the fight against malaria.

Where is this being done? Villages in either Papua New Guinea, the Solomon Islands, or Timor Leste
