The disastrous battle at Fromelles in WWI was caused by the poor planning and preparation of the British and Australian Generals. Instead of fighting over the usual distance of 200 yards, the soldiers had to face machine gun fire over 400 yards. Australian General McCay refused to authorise a truce to allow for the rescue of the injured Australians - the reason being that the Aussies might lose some of their fighting spirit if negotiations were undertaken. The result was there were over 5,000 casualties. Both David Holgate and Peter are descendants of soldiers who were involved in the battle. Very little publicity was given to the battle so that it doesn't have the profile of Gallipoli or the Kokoda track.






















GUEST SPEAKER: Joe Vescio

Joe spoke about the merger of the councils of the three shires, Bombala, Cooma and Snowy River to become the Snowy Monaro Regional Council on 12 May. Until 9 September 2017, when an election is held, Dean Lynch is the Administrator and Joe is the General Manager.

It is expected that the merger will result in improved services with savings in funds, that each community will have a voice, and that the whole area will have a shared vision. At all times the new council will be working to accommodate the different needs, attitudes, ideals and aspirations of each community. The use of technology such as videoconferencing is expected to save quite an amount of travel of council officers.
