

Settlement: the island was visited by Polynesians in about 1200 CE, and Captain Cook landed there in 1774. European settlement began in 1788 as a farming community with 23 settlers including 15 convicts and Lt Phillip Gidley King. This was abandoned in 1814 and it was reoccupied, 1825-1855, as a penal colony. Conditions were harsh for the convicts.

In 1856 descendants of the 'Bounty' mutineers arrived from Pitcairn Island. There are many historic buildings on the island as well as ruins. The stone was quarried on the island. Nowadays, the main industry is tourism as there is an ideal climate, the island being 2 hours' flying fime from Sydney. Administration of the island is being resumed by the Australian Government this July despite local opposition and this will give the island the infrastructure it urgently needs.
