GUEST SPEAKER – Richard Hill of Macenmist Black Truffles and Wines

Located 8km from Bredbo, Richard and Barbara's truffiere features truffle hunts and private events such as dinner and wine tasting. There are three types of trees used on the farm: Hazelnut, English Robor Oak and French Hek Oak. These trees were first planted in 2008 and have been inoculated with tuber melanosporum, the Perigord Black Truffle.

Dogs are used to locate the truffles which have been likened to underground mushrooms. They use air currents to detect the pesence of ripe truffles. Mecenmist's dog is Fahren, a Logotto Romagnolo or Italian Truffle dog.

The farm, about 200 acres, was originally part of Bredbo Station. Truffles require poor soil with a ph of 7.5 – 8.5. On one acre, they added 72 tonnes of lime to bring the ph up from 5.8. A lot of work was required to work the lime into the soil. The next step was to erect secure fencing – to keep out rabbits, and now wombats, and then irrigation. 400 trees were planted.

The trees and truffles have a symbiotic relationship: the trees take nutrients from the truffles that have taken nutrients from the soil. Once the truffle spores mate, they can't take carbohydrates from the soil but they can take them from the trees.

Note: Perigord Black Truffles can fetch up to \$3000 per ounce.
