

THREE MINUTER - Hass

The Four Way Test originated in Chicago when it was adopted by a businessman, Herbert J Taylor, who set out to save the Aluminum Cookware Distribution Company from insolvency. He decided that

the 250 employees needed a simple yardstick to guide them in all they thought, said and did. He came up with 24 words which we know as the Four Way Test. Through the adoption of these principles the company was saved and went on to be extremely successful. Rotary International took on the Four Way Test in the 1940s.

Electricity: how the market works and how our bill is determined.

THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL ELECTRICITY MARKET (NEM) - some facts

The NEM commenced operation as a wholesale spot maket for electricity in December 1988

Full retail competition in 2002 (NSW)


Removal of retail price cap in 2014 (NSW)

NEM: stretches 5,000 km with 51000 km of transmission lines and cables; supplies about 200,000,000 of MWh each year; supplies approx 9,000,000 customers; has a total electricity generating capacity of around 45,000 MW (as at August 2015); links up Qld, NSW, Victoria, Tasmania, and SA.

\$10.1 billion was traded in NEM in 2013-14.

Most of Australia's electricity comes from the use of fossil fuels: three quarters of electricity comes from coal fired stations; brown coal produces the most carbon dioxide, with less from black coal and gas.

Households consume a quarter of the electricity, commercial businesses and services another quarter, manufacturing a quarter, the remainder being used by agriculture, mining and service business.



Once electricity is produced it is transformed into a suitable voltage to to into the transmission grid (330,000 volts in NSW), and when it gets to a locality it is transformed down to a distribution voltage, eventually 240 volts.

Retailers and generators can go to futures exchanges (eg ASX) or to traders, such as banks, to acquire futures contracts.

Transmission and distribution lines are provided through a monopoly service, controlled by the Australian Energy Regulator.

Consumers can go to any retailer to get a competitive price for the supply of elecctricity.

Our electricity accounts have to cover costs of fluctuations in prices, the price being set every half hour; other costs to be covered are for the transportation system: our account then has a competitive component as well as a regulated component. Our total bill is approximately 30c. a kilowatt hour.
